Parade commences at 11 AM, Rain or Shine!

Application Closing Date: Applications must be received by June 15th, 2007

Confirmation: If you have not received your confirmation within 14 days after submitting your application, please contact Natasha Brown at 827- 2446.

Entry Approval: All entries must be approved by the Recreation, Culture and Heritage Department. The Recreation, Culture and Heritage Department decision regarding all entries is final.

Check In: Entries must report to the CHECK IN STATION in the parade assembly area for any up dated information and registration. Your position number and any additional information will be provided at that time. Your number assigned by the Canada Day Marshall will be marked on the street.

Position number: the Position number of every entry must appear on the lead vehicle (drivers side), so the parade judges and spectators can identify each entry.

Rules During the Parade:

- During the parade, entries must maintain a spacing of no less than 15 meters (50 feet) and no more than 30 meters (100 feet) behind the preceding unit and regulate their speed accordingly. Pacers and ambassadors will be stationed along the route to maintain spacing.
- Entries having completed the parade route will disperse along Hoppe Ave.

- Maps will be provided with dispersal information at the time of entry.
- Alcoholic beverages are forbidden on any float, in any vehicle or on the person of any participant. Participants consuming alcohol will not be permitted in the parade.

Insurance: All motorized and float entries must provide evidence of insurance for bodily injury and property damage liability with combined single limits of \$2,000,000.00. Please forward a copy of your insurance with your application.

The Recreation, Culture and Heritage Department reserve the right to refuse any entry and to remove them from the 2007 Canada Day Parade at any time.
