EnCana is a leading North American natural gas producer that is focused on growing its strong portfolio of prolific shale and other unconventional natural gas developments, called resource plays, in key basins from northeast British Columbia to east Texas and Louisiana. Our resource play strategy in the Grande Cache area is expected to deliver steady, reliable production for a considerable number of years.
